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# **INDIGENOUS GENDER BASED ANALYSIS**

Strategies North will be partnering with the Fort St John chapter of Sisters in Spirit to co-lead a workshop to analyze the intersectional gender gap amongst First Nations in Northern British Columbia. The workshop will be held at the Four Seasons Hotel in Vancouver, BC October 22-24. The workshops will provide an opportunity to engage with First Nations groups and communities, as well as government, industry, NGOs, and



other group representatives throughout Northern BC, and invite them to participate in a variety of formats. The workshop is intended to contribute to research that will build an understanding of Indigenous Gender Based Analysis, and will particularly focus on the effects of the resource economy on gender dynamics.

# **RURAL DIVIDEND**

Strategies North has had success with the Province of **BC's Rural Dividend** funding program throughout our longstanding relationship with the BC Rural dividend office. The **6th Intake** of the program, and the only intake for this year, officially **opened on June 15th**.

The BC Rural Dividend provides funding to assist **rural communities** with a population of 25,000 or less to reinvigorate and diversify their local economies. The program is focused on supporting projects that help rural communities navigate changes impacting their economies, such as attracting and retaining youth, using innovation to drive economic growth, and developing new and effective partnerships to support shared prosperity.

#### **Funding Streams:**

- 1) Project Development \$10,000
- 2) Single Applicant \$100,000
- 3) Partnerships \$500,000

**Eligibility:** The program is limited to:

- 1) Local Government
- 2) Indigenous Communities and Organizations
- 3) Not-for-profit Organization

**Application Deadline:** August 15

### **TERRACE NATION 2 NATION FORUM**

The 5th Annual Terrace Nation 2 Nation Forum will be taking place Oct 23-25, 2019. This three day event addresses the question of how we do business with Aboriginal people and their nation, and will feature keynote and panel speakers from around the Province. The goal of



the Forum is to bring together First Nations, Government, Industry and community leaders to continue the conversation about economic development and doing business with First Nations.

The Nation2Nation Forums will provide First Nations leaders with an opportunity to outline how Industry and Government can help address these priorities while working in partnership on resource development. Major topics include: Economic Development, Major Projects and Best Practices in Doing Business with First Nations.
