# LOW-CARBON ECONOMY CHALLENGE

## The Low Carbon Economy

**Challenge** is open to a wide range of applicants through two streams to support projects that reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, while also supporting clean growth.

### The Partnerships Stream was

created to support small and medium businesses with projects that reduce GHG emissions, encourage energy savings, and create jobs.

Eligible project sectors include: building energy efficiency and fuel switching, industrial, forestry, agriculture, waste, transportation, low-emissions fuel production, and electricity and/or energy production.

First Nations, Métis and Inuit government, communities, or organizations are eligible to receive a maximum level of 75% for federal assistance as a percentage of total eligible expenditures.

**Application Deadline:** March 8, 2019

**Eligibility:** The Partnerships stream is limited to:

• Indigenous communities and organizations

- $\cdot$  Small and medium-sized businesses
- · Not-for-profit organizations
- $\cdot$  Small municipalities
